### another / other

We use **another** only with singular nouns:  
e.g. 'Give me **another** pen, please'.

We often use **other** with plural nouns:  
e.g. 'Give me some **other** pens, please'.

<b>Give me an example of a pronoun. Give me another example.</b>	<i>'She' is an example of a pronoun. 'Mine' is another example.</i>
<b>Are we going to have the next lesson in another classroom?</b>	<i>No, we aren't going to have the next lesson in another classroom.</i>
<b>Have you studied other foreign languages?</b>	<i>Yes, I have studied other foreign languages.</i>
<b>Have you travelled to any foreign countries?</b>	<i>Yes, I've travelled to some foreign countries.</i>
<b>What foreign countries have you travelled to?</b>	<i>I have travelled to such foreign countries as India and Japan.</i>
<b>Would you like to travel to other countries?</b>	<i>Yes, I would like to travel to other countries.</i>

<p><b>What can students do if they are not sure how to use a difficult word?</b> <b>What are the two things some people say that we can be sure of? Do you agree?</b> <b>What's the capital of Brazil?
